Presentation Overview

To safeguard Christian virtue and morality's central role in American self-government, the early Americans established a cohesive social network in the context of a Christian, Biblical worldview. In every domain the learner occupied—home, church, school, and community—clear, consistent messages constantly reinforced the learner's knowledge and understanding of biblical moral precepts and the authority and sanctions that accompanied them. The progressive abandonment of this worldview in the context of a shared moral culture has led to dire consequences in all aspects of society.

The church, as the body of Christ, is uniquely positioned to engage people in moral renewal efforts where a Christian, Biblical worldview in the context of a shared moral culture is cultivated. Christian faith communities must place a special emphasis on strengthening families as a force for moral change. Each person must understand their pivotal influence as moral agents in the multiple leadership roles they fulfill as Christians. This presentation seeks to reawaken the concept of a Christian, Biblical worldview in the hearts and minds of God's people who are called to reshape the culture for Christ.

Ladona Clayton

Ladona Clayton is the Superintendent of Clovis Christian Schools in Clovis, New Mexico. She earned her Bachelors and Masters degrees from Eastern New Mexico University where she graduated summa cum laude. She earned her doctorate from Oral Roberts University in December 2009 and received the Outstanding Doctoral Graduate Award in 2010.

Dr. Clayton was in public education for 20 years when God called her to private, Christian education in 2009 with the intent of reinstating God's original design for living through the lens of a Christian, Biblical worldview in the context of a shared moral culture. In 2010, she was invited to become an associate of The Coventry Group, which is a unique trans-denominational partnership of conservative Christians dedicated to serving local congregations of the body of Christ with education, training, and facilitation in all aspects of strategy, including the development of church leaders.

Dr. Clayton is currently completing her book, *Toward a Shared Culture of Faith Through Education*, which is scheduled for publication in winter 2012. According to Dr. Bill Cook of The Coventry Group, "this book makes a compelling case for the restoration of our shared culture of faith through education. The "why," "what," and "how" are presented here in what is currently the most thoroughly researched and most convincingly argued treatment of this critical subject."
