Presentation Overview

"How Ordinary People Can Change the World: When a Mission Has a Church?"

The Body is the place where the baptized are guided and encouraged to discover his or her mission field. This series is a shift from "body-ministry" to "member-ministry." Body-ministry says, "Ministry only happens as a whole in the Church." Member-ministry says, "The body exists to help each member live his or her daily life as a missionary for Jesus Christ out in the world from Monday to Saturday." The question for our main line churches today is, "What do we want to produce: compliant loyal members or missionaries who want to impact their mission arenas with faith, hope, love, and justice?" It would require us to think through how we do Church. Are we a center for ministry or a center for refreshment for all the missions that take place outside our walls?

Rev. Canon Scott Ruthven

The Reverend Canon Scott A. Ruthven, Canon of Pastoral Theology and Examining Chaplain in the Diocese of the Rio Grande, currently serves as Rector of St. Andrew's Episcopal Church in Las Cruces, NM. He additionally serves as a Chaplain Colonel in the USAFR, attached to the office of the Command Chaplain of STRATCOM, Offutt, AFB, NE.

Fr. Scott is a gifted teacher and has served as an adjunct professor for Trinity Seminary, Ambridge, PA.

Fr. Scott and Mary Jo have been married for 34 years. They have three grown children: Leah, Aaron, and Caleb. The Ruthvens have led numerous tours to the Holy Land and Jordan, introducing hundreds to the sight and sounds of biblical culture.
